Public Law 280

- O Federal Law which created a method where States assume jurisdiction over tribal lands
- O 9 Federally Recognized Tribes
- O All Tribes except Warm Springs, Umatilla Tribe, and Burns-Paiute Tribe

Senate Bill 412

O Authorized compliant Tribal Police Departments to have Police Authority on and off Tribal Lands.

O All Tribal Police Departments in Oregon (along with the Columbia Inter-Tribal Fisheries Enforcement) are SB 412

Located within North Bend, Coos County, Oregon



Crime Prevention through Environmental Design

CPTED evaluates the crime environment and features of the environment that facilitate crime or undesirable behaviors.

CPTED attempts to remove or reduce these opportunities by changing various aspects of both environmental design and use of the environment

Crime Prevention through Environmental Design

Natural Surveillance Cut back the trail so it is visible from street level

Natural Access Control Ensure the lights are functioning

Territorial Reinforcement

 Post sign at entrance of trail identifying "Tribal Property"
